Sub. conj.

\* (Before lunch), we met our friends. (Simple Sent)

\* [Before we went to lunch], [we met our friends.]

We went to lunch, and we met our friends. (Complex)

We went to lunch and met our friends. (Simple)

Complex Sent → if ind. clause is first, you don't need a comma.

If dep. clause is first, you DO NEED a comma.

because of the dog (phrase)

because the dog barked (clause)

Sub. conj.

\* Before lunch, we met our friends. Simple Sent

Annotations: (SS) above "Before lunch", (SP) above "we", DO above "met our friends".

\* [Before we went to lunch], [we met our friends].

Annotations: ~~conj~~ above "Before", conj above "and", ind above "we met our friends".

We went to lunch, and we met our friends. Complex

Annotations: SS above "We", (SP) above "went", conj above "and", SS above "we", SP above "met our friends".

We went to lunch and met our friends Comp

Annotations: (SS) above "We", (SP) above "went", DO above "to lunch", (SP) above "met", DO above "our friends".

Complex Sent → if ind. clause is first, you don't need a comma.

If dep. clause is first, you DO NEED a comma.
